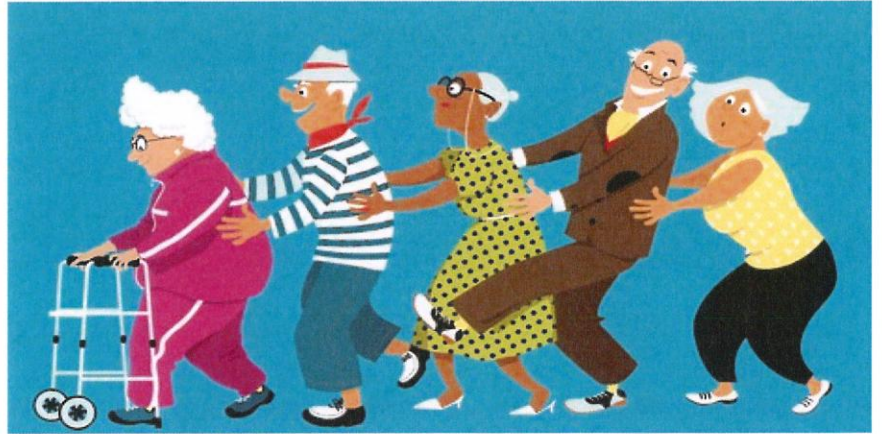


# HILLVIEW MANOR NEWSLETTER 2023

Now that I'm older here's what I've discovered

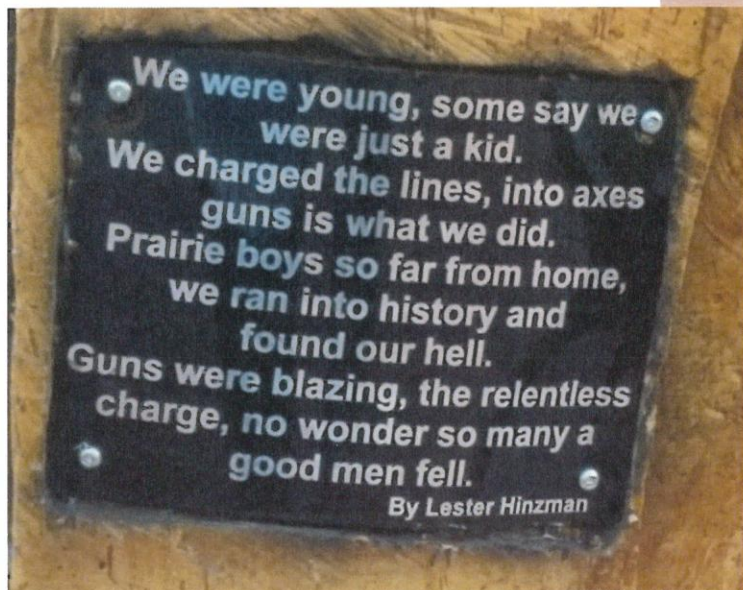
1. I started out with nothing and still have most of it

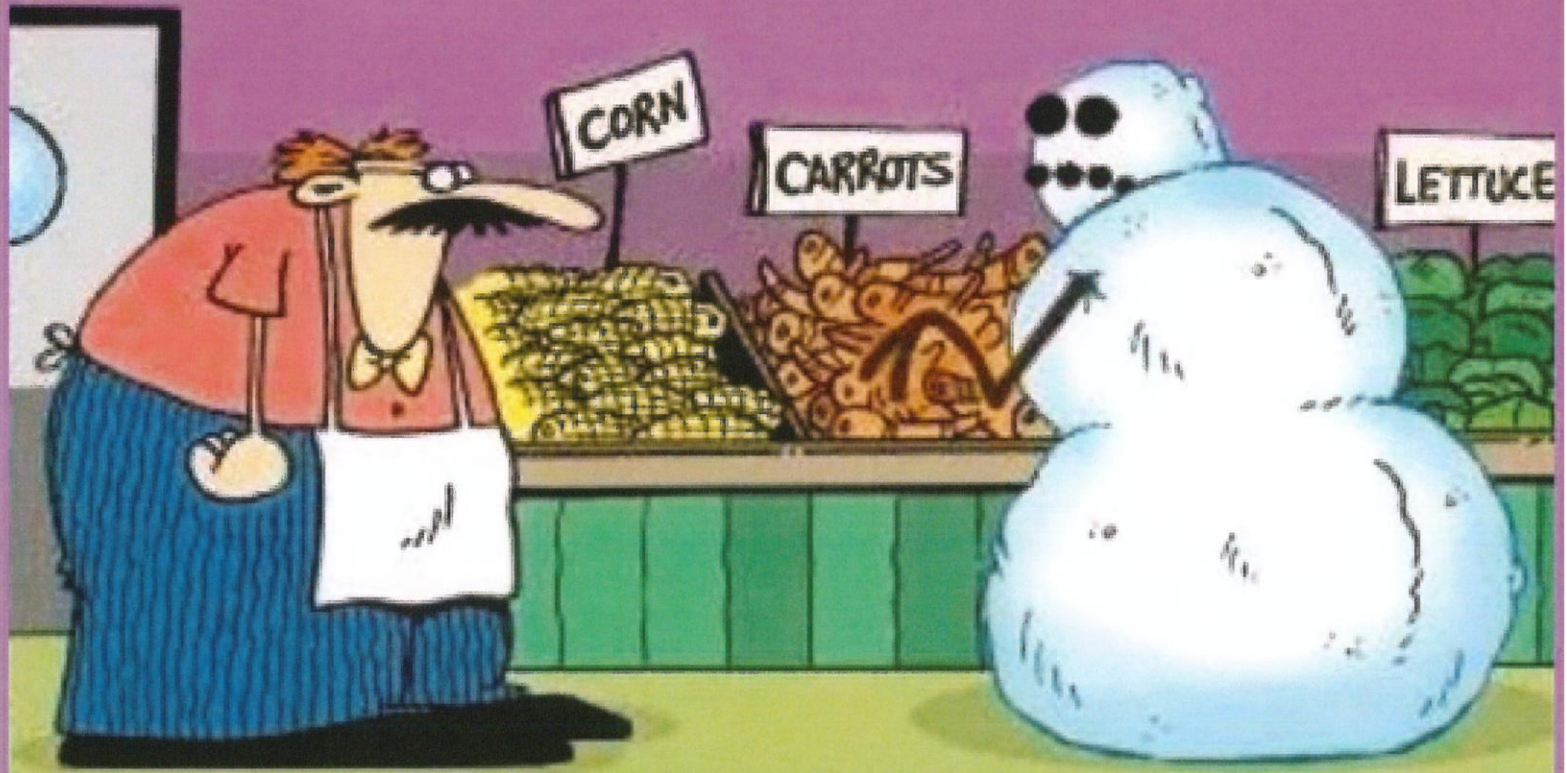








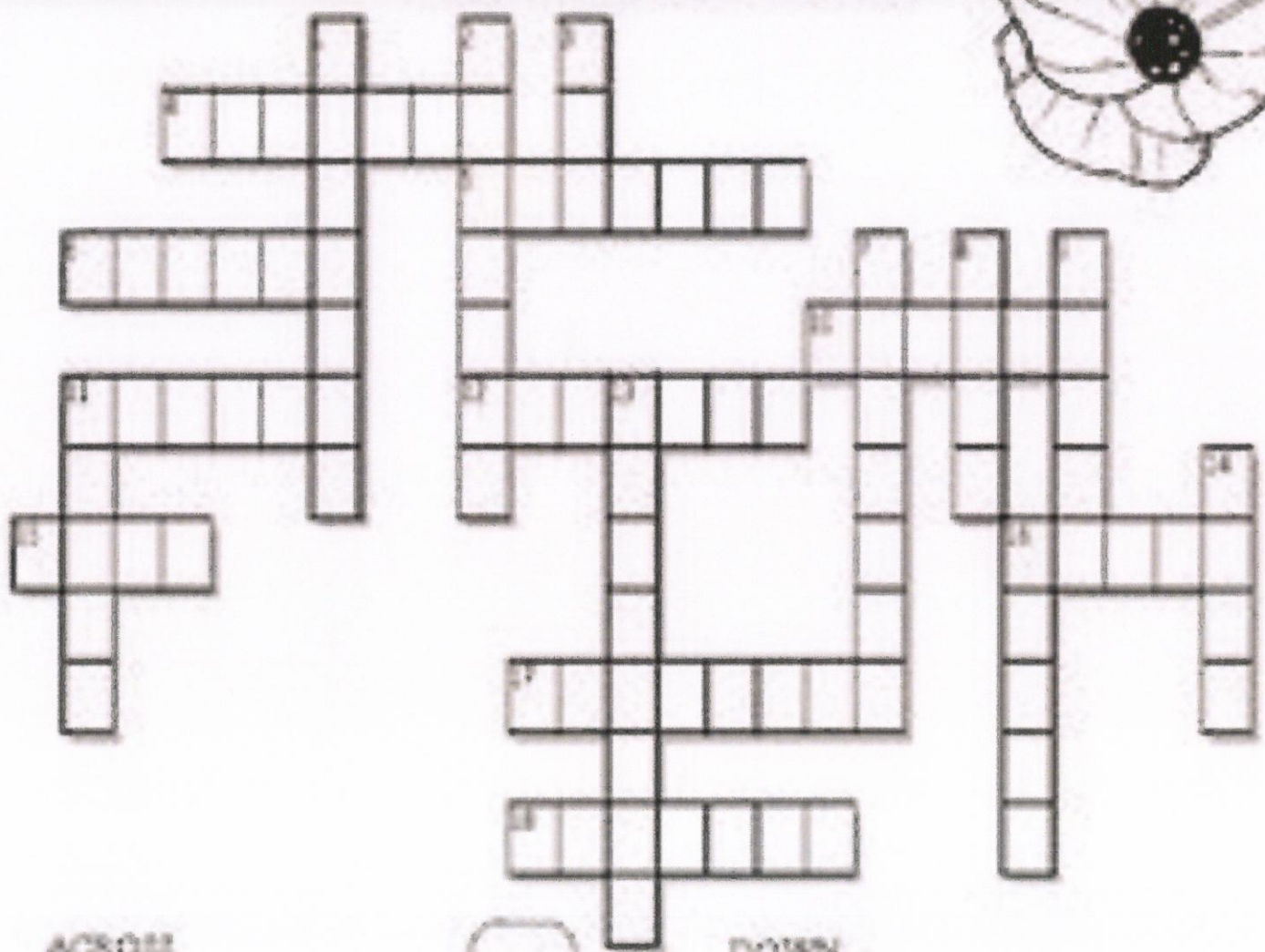


