

He also was certain that not a better man lived on earth then his Pa.







Paul rarely made just one of his creations unless it was something special for his wife of 68 years, Bertha. Often Paul would make as least 9 so that each of his 8 children also got one. Occassionally Paul made projects for his sisters or other relatives and friends.

With a creative eye, a steady hand and meticulous attention to detail Paul perfected his craft.

Over the years he has worked with a variety of techniques including intricate scroll working and Intarsia, which is the creation of a picture by fitting together various shapes, sizes and kinds of different wood.


Paul has always loved woodworking. His many creations are treasured by all who have been lucky enough to receive them.












