#### Victoria Day



Victoria Day is a National holiday celebrated on the first Monday preceding May 25<sup>th</sup> in order to make it the first long weekend of the summer season.

Queen Victoria was born on May 24, 1819.

Following the death of three uncles and her father, she became Queen of the United Kingdom on June 2, 1837 and reigned until her death on January 22, 1901. After her death, May 25<sup>th</sup> became known as Empire Day. In 1952, Empire Day was moved to the Monday before May 25 and since 1953, the official birthday of Queen Elizabeth II has been celebrated on this date in Canada. In 1958, Empire Day became known as Commonwealth Day, which was moved to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday in March. The Monday before May 25 then became known as Victoria Day, which is a Canadian Statutory Holiday and a day marking the beginning of the summer season when gardens are planted, summer resorts and parks are opened, and people open up their cottages.

**MAY 2025:** temperature 12.5°C (3°C above avg. east, avg. west); Precipitation 62.5mm (35mm below avg. east, 60mm above west)

May 15 – 21: Sunny east, intervals of thunderstorms, some heavy we very warm

May 22 – 31: Showers, very warm east; thunderstorms, warm west



#### The Origin of Some Old Sayings

#### Don't throw the baby out with the bath water

Yes, baths in the 1500s were rare but when they were taken, it was in a big tub filled with hot water. There was, naturally, a pecking order. The man of the house had the privilege of the nice clean water (and he was probably the dirtiest), and then came all the other sons and men, then the women and finally the children. Last of all were the babies. By then the water was so dirty you could actually lose someone in it. Hence, the saying "Don't throw the baby out with the bath water".



Raining cats and dogs

Those lucky enough to have houses, had houses with thatched roofs made from thick straw, piled high, with no wood underneath. This was the only place for animals to get warm, so all the pets ... dogs, cats and other small animals like mice and rats, lived in the roof. When it rained it became slippery and sometimes the animals would slip and fall from the roof. Hence "It's raining cats and dogs."

#### Don't let the bedbugs bite

Despite the skills of the best thatcher there was really nothing to stop things from falling into the house. This posed a real problem in the bedroom where bugs and other droppings could really mess up your nice clean bed (relatively speaking). So, they found if they made beds with big posts and hung a sheet over the top, it addressed the problem. Hence, those beautiful big 4 poster beds with canopies. "Good night and don't let the bed bugs bite!"



#### Pease porridge hot

In the kitchen they cooked in a big kettle that always hung over the fire. Every day they lit the fire and added things to the pot. They mostly ate vegetables and didn't get much meat. They would eat the stew for dinner leaving leftovers in the pot to get cold overnight and then start over the next day. Sometimes the stew had food in it that been in there for a month. Hence the rhyme: "Pease porridge hot, pease porridge cold, pease porridge in the pot nine days old."

#### **Upper Crust**

Bread was devised according to status. Workers got the burnt bottom of the loaf, the family got the middle, and guests got the top, or the "upper crust."


